More Than a Resolution

I've proclaimed my fair share of New Year's resolutions in my lifetime. I'm also proud to say that I have, with 100% accuracy, kept zero of those. I'm not proud of failing, but it is something that I've done completely and fully (with 100% accuracy). Many times in life, I've been more of a hit or miss kind of guy.

That kind of track record doesn't fly in the Christian lifestyle. Meaning, the life Christ has called us to is one that is all or nothing. You might hear a popular, watered-down, feel-good presentation of Christianity, if you listen to the whispers and musings of popular culture. But again, you won't find support for that in Scripture.

What are some of the basics? Number one, it involves repentance. Repentance is a dynamic shift in direction. Without Christ, I move forward with one goal in mind: I will please and serve myself above all else. With Christ, I move forward in the opposite direction: I will please and serve Christ Jesus above all else.

Jesus said, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24 NIV). The journey begins with death to self and the former ways of doing things. Jesus becomes the LORD and ruler of your life, rather than yourself. When we die to our old self and our old ways, we find new life in Jesus.

Paul says to the church in Rome, "We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?" (Romans 6:2). The life we now live in Christ is distinctly different. Not only does it demonstrate the transformative power of His blood and Spirit, but it also sets us apart from those who are perishing.

The time for a change isn't in the tradition of a New Year's resolution. The time for change is here and now.

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. (Galatians 2:20)

Additionally, the picture of Jesus Christ as our cornerstone creates an incredible image of the firm foundation we are building our faith upon.


God has entrusted parents/caregivers with the gift of raising kids to know and love The Lord. We are thankful to provide a wonderful resource to families in that mission!

Bob and Barb Van Wyk Update



This summer we trained 32 people for our primary school ministry (GEMS) in Francistown, which is the second largest city in Botswana. Some work has already begun here but we are trusting that the impact will now be much larger as these people mobilize and enter the schools. Our main prayer point is they will launch and begin going into the schools. (This continues to be the main sticking point.) They desire for children to hear the truth of God's word, come and enjoy the training, but the thought of standing in front of hundreds of children, let alone teachers, intimidates them enough not to step out in faith and follow through to sharing with the children.

We are trying to implement different methods to encourage them to begin so pray for effective strategies to accomplish this.

We traveled to the country of Lesotho and met with at least 50 Sunday School teachers, hoping they will also begin GEMS training in their schools there. Then we traveled to Mozambique to work with them on casting vision for reaching the children in their country through GEMS as well. We pray that the Lord will anoint all these times and that each country would catch the vision of reaching the children in their respective countries.

We greatly appreciate Hope Church's partnership with us as we work at going international.


