# Pray for Me

Did it do anything for his immediate pain? Not that I'm aware of. What it did accomplish was this – He was prayed for. He was not forgotten. He knew that I actually obeyed God's Word. He knew that I wasn't just feeding him a line, simply to be 'nice.'

May God give me the motivation and the courage to pray whenever an opportunity arises. May He do the same for you.

And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

# **QUAKE 2025**

March 21-23, our Sr. High Youth Group had the incredible opportunity to attend the Quake event in Minneapolis, Minnesota. From the moment we arrived, we knew this was going to be a special experience, one that would challenge us, strengthen our faith, and bring us closer together as a group.

The theme of the weekend was centered around John 3:16, reminding us of the unfailing love God has for each of us. Throughout every session, worship set, and conversation, we were reminded of a simple but powerful truth: We are enough. It was a message that resonated deeply with all of us, encouraging us to see ourselves the way God does; loved, chosen, and worthy.

"Packer" Dave, our speaker for the weekend, brought this message to life with energy and passion, sharing stories that were both inspiring and relatable. He had a way of making us laugh one moment and think deeply the next, helping us see that our faith isn't just something we talk about, it's something we live. And Echelon, the worship band, filled the room with powerful music that made it impossible not to feel God's presence moving through us. Whether we were singing or standing in quiet reflection, the music became a way for us to connect with God in a meaningful way.

In addition to the main sessions, we took part in breakout groups that focused on different aspects of our faith. From leadership and prayer to hands-on service projects like packing meals for children in need, these moments gave us a chance to apply what we were learning in real ways. It was incredible to see how everyone engaged, stepping out of their comfort zones to grow both individually and as a group.

This trip felt different from others we've taken together. Maybe it was the way we worshiped, the conversations we had, or the way we saw God working in each other's lives. Whatever it was, we left Minneapolis feeling renewed, encouraged, and closer than ever, not just as a youth group, but as a family in Christ.

The quake reminded us that we are enough. Not because of anything we've done, but because of who God is. And as we returned home, we continued to carry that truth with us, ready to live out our faith!

# **MISSIONS**

## CHASING THE SIGNAL

Reaching the people of Nepal where even cars and trucks are not seen.

Pastor Maahir, a recent Nepali Bible College graduate and local church leader, shifts the phone to his other ear and keeps listening. The voice on the line sounds young and hesitant. "I am not a Christian," she quickly adds. "No one in my family is a Christian. We are very strict Hindus." In Nepal, more than 80% of the population practices Hinduism, while Christians make up less than 2%. Government policies have become increasingly restrictive, making evangelism illegal and punishable by fines or imprisonment. Yet, despite these challenges, the gospel continues to spread. Words of Hope Ministry produces gospel radio programs that air across Nepal, offering a safe way for seekers to hear the message of Christ. The programs provide contact information so that listeners can connect with local pastors when they have questions. Pastor Maahir asks the young woman if she listens with her family. She explains that the radio signal isn't strong in her home, so she climbs to a high point nearby whenever the program airs—listening in secret, but hungry for truth. "I want to go to church," she says, "but my family does not allow me to." For now, she texts the pastor after each program, seeking answers. "When I listen to the sermons on the radio, I feel blessed," she says.

Despite Nepal's restrictive policies, Christianity is growing—and you are part of the story! Pastor Maahir explains how radio is fueling this movement: "Here in Nepal, we don't have many experienced church leaders. I studied at Bible college, but there was still much I didn't know." Words of Hope partners with a Nepali church congregation with theologically trained leaders who are passionate about equipping pastors across Nepal. Their sermons are adapted into radio programs that reach people in cities and remote villages alike. "I listen to the broadcasts myself," says Pastor Maahir. "I learn, I preach what I have learned, and more people come to know the Word." Believers gather in homes, fields, and workplaces—listening together, sharing what they've heard, and inviting others to tune in. The message of Christ is multiplying!

January 2025 giving and attendance was reviewed by Jason

Team reports: (Purposeful Living) Dean reported a good turnout for the Superbowl party. Numbers were similar to last year and students were fine with not having all extra activities due to space restrictions.

(Passionate Worship) Jason indicated that they are excited about the new changes regarding the sound system and tech upgrades. They are talking about recommending a stipend position to manage the tech aspects. Jason stated that they are looking at ways to try and recruit more people to play the drums. Jason indicated that they are starting to work on Easter service.
