Impacting Culture

Hollywood impacts culture directly. When the name, "Hollywood," is used, it represents an entire industry, not just a location in Southern California. Hollywood describes the media industry (film, TV, streaming services, news, music, influencers and so much more).

Our children are not the only benefactors of Hollywood, we are too. Because of that, the content Hollywood produces infiltrates our vehicles, our homes, our minds and our hearts. When the substance of their productions nestle into the sacred walls of our hearts and minds, their ideology begins to shape our own.

What can we do about it? Three things. First, seek the Kingdom of God before anything else (Matthew 6:33). Fill your mind and heart with His Word. As one of the psalmists says, "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:11). Second, use discernment when selecting your entertainment and news sources. Ask yourself if the content truly is uplifting, honors God and edifies His Body – the Church. Paul says, "Whatever is true...noble...right...pure...lovely...admirable...excellent or praiseworthy, think about such things" (Philippians 4:8). Third, pray for Hollywood.

Prayer might sound like an understatement, but it is truly a way God has given us to take action in this world. My friend, Karen Covell, founded the Hollywood Prayer Network (HPN) in 2001. Her vision for the HPN is to equip and encourage intercessors across the globe to lift the entire entertainment industry in prayer, because, "it is a redeemable place, full of redeemable people."

We have just signed on as a local chapter for the HPN. What does this mean? It means, in the coming weeks, months and years, we will aggressively and intentionally pray for the industry. The opportunities are limitless. The engagement depends on our willingness to stand our ground, on our knees, pleading before the Throne of Grace for His Spirit to convict the hearts of the ones who shape culture.
