Dearest friends in Christ,

As the gentle warmth of spring continues to unfold around us here in Spencer, I find myself reflecting on the beautiful connections we've cultivated together. It's within these very bonds, these shared moments of laughter, support, and even quiet reflection, that the truest messages often find their way into our hearts. Paul warned, "See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ" (Colossians 2:8).

So, how do we defend ourselves? How do we prepare to stand on truth when so much deception is being dispensed all around us? The psalmist writes, "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:11 NIV). Hank Hanegraaff says to, "Be so familiar with the truth that when counterfeits loom on the horizon, [you] recognize them instantaneously." Let us be a people of His Word. Read it. Consume it. Digest it. Treasure it. Speak it. Live it.

Crossroads Prison Ministries

Gregory grew up in a Christian family from a young age, but like many raised in the church, his spiritual life had its share of highs and lows. At fifteen, his parents' divorce triggered a crisis of faith that left him feeling lost. "For the next 6-7 years, I lived without any direction, although deep in my heart I truly desired to know God," Gregory shared.

As a young adult, he turned to drugs and alcohol, falling into the grip of addiction. "There was a long period in my life in which I heavily used and abused drugs and alcohol and became entrenched in addiction," he admitted. Around the age of 21, Gregory found his way back to God. "I have spent every day since growing closer to Him and seeking a deeper revelation of Him," he said.

However, the battle was far from over. Gregory continued to struggle with the strongholds of addiction. When he finally sought help, his journey took an unexpected turn. "I felt such utter shame and conviction over [things I had done] that I knew I needed help and made the decision to come forward of my own volition," he said. That decision led to a 10-year prison sentence and two years of parole.

But prison became a place of transformation. "I spent my time in prison really pressing into God and seeking His face," Gregory recalled. He immersed himself in Bible studies, completing dozens of programs. Among them was the **Crossroads** mentorship program.

What impacted him most wasn't just the lessons—it was the Christ-centered relationship he formed with his Crossroads mentor. Through her letters and guidance, she became like a grandmother to him, offering encouragement and support.

Hope Church supports the work of **Crossroads Prison Ministries** with our mission's money. This season reminds us of God's grace and boundless love - a love that offers endless chances to start fresh. This message of hope and renewal can transform lives for men and women incarcerated worldwide. With our support, **Crossroads** provides free lessons, Bibles, and letters of encouragement from mentors to remind them they are not forgotten.

REGULAR BUSINESS

Approved February 13, 2025 meeting minutes-MMSC (Kevin/Jason). Correction: Kevin stated they have talked with Michael about other projects to address once the basement has been finished.

February 2025 giving and attendance was reviewed by Alex

Around the room check in with each of the consistory and pastors

Team reports: (**Purposeful Living**) Dean indicated that Julia was feeling positive about improvements made to classrooms. Nursery has new carpet and Dean helped with updating a laptop for use in the nursery. Jay reported that this will be the biggest middle school group they have had for a retreat with 65 students/adults attending. There are 21 individuals going on the senior high retreat in Minneapolis. (3/21-23). (Wholehearted Service) Mark reported that Kristal has been busy with bringing meals to those who have had babies recently. She has done this for 7 families. Jill is feeling like things have been going well with administration issues. (Holy Living) Gary stated that Terry Stevens, adult discipleship director indicated they had 25 people signed up for the next Rooted Series starting March 16th. They will have 3 groups. Women's ministry has an all-day retreat April 12th. (Meaningful Fellowship) Doug reported that greeters and ushers have been active. Consistory members have gotten feedback from individuals that they have felt like they have been welcomed beyond what the greeters do at the door. Discussion was had regarding security issues once greeters leave their post/area at the Harbor entrance. Discussed having the CAPS team give some recommendations regarding access issues. (Passionate Worship) James shared that there was one person who had applied for the Tech position that had been advertised. There have been no other applicants. Decision was made to leave the position open for the time identified in the initial job opening. If no other applications come in then the position will be closed and then will start background checks before we proceed any further.
