TAKE SOME TIME TO....THINK TAKE A MOMENT TO...MEDITATE

Corn, corn, corn, which is how some people describe the state of Iowa. The scene of corn everywhere is often boring for new residents or those who travel through the state. Soon the corn fields will be completely harvested. Over the years I have found that there are things about corn and corn fields, that we may be able to learn spiritual lessons in our relationship with God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

My responsibilities and commitments as a Pastor have found me traveling among many corn fields across lowa over the years. While driving on those occasions I have always been intrigued by the beauty of the corn fields. For me there is a beauty about the orderliness and symmetry of the rows of corn. Then as the corn grows and the rows are filled in, it becomes a sea of dark green when the wind rustles and moves the plants like waves on the ocean. I am reminded of the creative and sustaining work of God as Master Designer. Our Creator has made the earth, the soil, seeds, the sun and sends the rain. By His grace a farmer plants, tills and harvests the crops.

May we learn to thank the Lord for all that He alone provides. May we trust in Him and Him alone for sending the rain and the sunshine. Isn't the Lord our God, the creator and sustainer of nature, the author of love and eternal life in Jesus Christ magnificent and wonderful?

Let me pick (pun intended) another thought about the corn fields, which struck me in relationship to the body of Christ. A single corn stalk by itself is susceptible. By itself it is more prone to the damaging effects of wind. But in a whole field the other corn plants break the force of the wind for one another. In the church (the body of Christ) with the use of Bible studies, prayer groups and friendships, we can break the destructive winds of life as we share and pray for each other. In a corn field it is always interesting to see how the wind also blows the pollen around in the fertilization of the plants to produce the ear. And so, we need each other to encourage and stimulate one another toward continued growth in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ, resulting in the fruit of the Holy Spirit and the harvest of righteousness (right living or behavior pleases the Lord).

As the corn plants grow the ground is shaded, thus deterring the evaporation of the moisture, resulting in stimulated growth and nourishment. The same is true once again for the fellowship of believers. We need to intercede and help each other in prayer, seeking the Lord's protection. We need to nurture and motivate each other in the sharing of Jesus Christ and His word, Who is the true, living water of life.

But there is also individual responsibility and accountability. As the corn plant is made by the Lord; its leaves collect and funnel the water down to the base of the plant. Likewise, we as individual Christians need to make it the commitment of our lives to hide the Word of the Lord in our hearts and minds. We need to make ourselves available to preaching, teaching, study, meditation and obedience of the Word of the Lord (the Bible), seeking to live daily according to His will and ways. Then and only then, can we gather with others from week to week in Sunday morning worship, small group Bible studies and prayer times, youth fellowship, and individual friendships to break the winds of our unfriendly culture, shade and help each other just as God created the rows and fields of corn to do.

These are a few of my reflections, while meditating on the miles of corn rows. Maybe there are some thoughts you may have as you let Jesus Christ teach you in the daily things of life as you seek to grow in the grace, knowledge and love of the Lord.

Let us walk with the Lord and with each other in daily living and weekly worship!



Six Ways to Serve

Pastor James' message on Sunday, November 5, will focus on God's calling on every believer, including the call to "Go, and make disciples of all nations..." And Jesus made it clear that He will not return until that task is completed, as recorded in the Gospels: "And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come." (Matthew 24:14)

According to the Joshua Project https://joshuaproject.net/unreached/10, 7,398 or 42.4% of the 17,453 distinct people groups remain unreached with the Gospel, and there is much work for us to do in obedience to our Lord's command.

When we think of missions to unreached people groups, most of us think only of the command to "Go" to a mission field in some foreign country. Everyone who calls Jesus Lord should be open to hearing the Lord call them to Go, and to obeying that call. But we know that He does not call every believer to participate in missions in that way.

Your call to **Go** may mean becoming engaged in local mission or a short-term mission trip.

In addition to **Going**, there are at least five other ways the Lord might call us to reach the nations with the Gospel.

- Learn Seek out information regarding specific missionaries, including those Hope Church supports. Learn about specific unreached people groups and countries, through resources such as the Joshua Project or Open Doors. Sign up for the newsletters many of our missionaries send on a \ regular basis.
- **Pray** Pray individually or with other believers for local and global missions involving people you know or those our church supports. Ask the Lord to send workers into the harvest and to open doors for the Gospel where access is limited.
- **Send** Enable those who are called to Go by committing your resources to specific local or global missions. Add your individual support to the church's existing support for those connected with Hope Church.
- **Welcome** Sometimes we go to the nations and other times the nations come to us. Seek out and welcome international visitors, immigrants, and refugees who come to Spencer or nearby communities.
- **Mobilize** Embrace the call to become engaged with missions locally, regionally, and globally and seek out and encourage others to explore how they can serve as well.

Remember, the call to go and make disciples of all nations is on each of us, not just a few. Let us take the next step of obedience to His call, whatever it may be.
