The Armor or God and His Mighty Power

Are there times when you feel powerless as a Christian, weak with little or no spiritual strength?

For the next several months I want to discuss what it means to be strong in the Lord and the power of His might. We will talk about spiritual warfare, which may be a new term or truth for many of us. Since we are involved in a spiritual war; it is important that we know who our enemy is, how he works and what we can do in the battles and the war that is going on. We need to be strong in the Lord and put on the whole armor of God to experience His mighty power.

In Ephesians 6:10-12, we read, "Be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places."

According to this passage we are in a struggle and war with a formidable enemy and an array of evil hosts. A Christian song writer put it this way, "In this life we are not involved in some recreational jaunt, it's a battlefield, not a recreational room, it's a fight not a game." Many Christians don't believe this; they are not aware of this reality. As a result, they are weak, with little or no spiritual strength.

In the Bible we read the story of Job, who experienced the attacks of Satan, then there is Daniel, whose prayers were not answered because of evil spiritual beings in the heavenly realms. Then there are verses in the New Testament. Jesus, Himself is tested and tempted in the wilderness. In a paraphrase of Romans 7:23, the Apostle Paul says this, "when I want to do good, evil is right there with me. For in my inner being I delight in God's law; but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me."

In 2nd Corinthians 10:4, we read, "For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world."

In 1st Timothy 1:18, 6:12, we read, "I give you this instruction in keeping with the prophecies once made about you, so that by following them you fight the good fight, holding on to faith and a good conscience. Fight the good fight of faith."

Everyone one of us, who have made a commitment of our life to Jesus and a public profession of our faith in Him as our Lord and Saviour, need to put on the armor of God. We need to know how to battle with the enemy and protect ourselves.

We all use some kind of protective and safety measures to protect our house from thieves, etc. We use locks on our doors, have adequate lighting and maybe even a dog to warn us of intruders. It is vitally important that we are protected spiritually.

Therefore, we need to be protected by the armor of God and know His strength in the temptations and attacks of the evil one. Yes, there is an evil one. And you might ask, who is our enemy?

The devil is our enemy, he is not just some make believe character with a red suit, pointed ears and a pronged fork in his hand. The devil is real and is most often called Satan in the Bible. The following names and descriptive phrases about Satan are also found in the Scriptures:

The god of this world...1 Cor. 4:4

Masquerades as an Angel of Light... 2 Cor.11:14

A Hinderer... 1 Thess. 2:18

An adversary, restless lion, devourer... 1 Pet. 5:8

A Deceiver... 2 Cor.11:3

Prince of the power of the Air... Eph. 2:2

A Tempter... 2 Thess. 3:5

A beast ... Rev. 19:19

When a Christian recognizes who the enemy is and how he works, then they can resist and fight. We cannot be strong in the Lord and the power of His might, until we put on the full armor of God and take a stand against the devil's schemes. Next time we will begin to take a look at each piece of the armor and how to use it against Satan's schemes.
